INTENDED USE: IN VITRO DIAGNOSTIC USE

This product is intended for qualitative immunohistochemistry with normal and neoplastic formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded tissue sections, to be viewed by light microscopy.

DESCRIPTION: Key players in the Notch pathway are the TLE genes, which are human homologs of the Drosophila Groucho gene. Groucho is a transcriptional repressor that plays a key role in neurogenesis, segmentation and sex determination. Transducin-like enhancer protein 1 (TLE1) is a protein that is encoded by the TLE1 gene and is involved in control of hematopoiesis, neuronal, and terminal epithelial differentiation. Positive immunohistochemical nuclear staining with anti-TLE-1 has been shown to be a useful addition to an IHC panel when differentiating synovial sarcoma from other soft tissue malignancies.

MICROBIOLOGICAL STATE: This product is not sterile.

PRETREATMENT: Staining of formalin-fixed tissue sections requires treating the tissue sections in boiling 10mM citrate buffer, pH 6.0, for 10-20 minutes followed by cooling at room temperature for 20 min.

PRIMARY ANTIBODY INCUBATION TIME: 30 minutes at Room Temperature

STAINING TIPS: If the staining is too light, use lower dilution or longer time. If the staining is

too strong, check pretreatment, use higher dilution or shorter time.

STORAGE AND STABILITY: This product contains sodium azide and is stable for 24 months when stored

at 2-8°C. Do not use after expiration date indicated on label of the product. If reagent

is not stored as recommended, performance must be validated by the user.
